

Section 6: Final Exit from Early ACCESS

Final exit codes Final Exit Reason codes are used when a child who has been receiving Early Intervention services and on an IFSP is leaving the Early ACCESS. The codes are located on the *IFSP Transition Plan*.

Final Exit Reason codes are different than change codes. When a child moves to another area within a region or in the state and remains in Early ACCESS, change codes are to be used. Change codes are found on the *IFSP Early Intervention Services*.

The following table provides Final Exit Reason codes.

Note. Iowa IFSP refers to an Iowa funded IFSP; it does not necessarily mean the IFSP was written by Iowa providers.

Code	Reason	Description
PMA	Completion of IFSP p rior to reaching age 3 (m aximum a ge).	Child who has not reached age 3, has completed his/her IFSP, and no longer requires services under IDEA, Part C. <i>Note.</i> PMA would be a rare code to use for a child age 2 years, 9 months and older because of the transition activities/services (of either pathway) that are provided at least 3 months prior to child's third birthday.
EFB	E ligible f or B , exiting Part C.	Child served in Part C who exited Part C and was determined to be eligible for Part B. Part B eligibility refers to a child who has been determined according to State and Federal criteria to have a disability that requires special education and related services. <i>Note.</i> This includes a child determined eligible, however, parent(s) declined special education services.

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Final exit codes
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EOP	Not eligible for Part B, exited with referrals to other programs	<p>Child who reached age 3 (third birthday); team had conducted Suspected Disability discussion; was determined not eligible for Part B either through the Suspected Disability discussion or a full and individual initial evaluation for special education determination; and was referred to other programs.</p> <p>EOP is also used for a child who reached age 3 (third birthday); team had conducted Suspected Disability discussion and child was suspected of having a disability; and parent(s) declined consideration for Part B eligibility determination; and was referred to other programs.</p> <p>Referrals to other programs may include, but is not limited to preschool learning centers, Head Start (but not receiving Part B services), child care centers, health, and nutrition services, such as WIC.</p> <p>Referral means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A referral by an IFSP team member to a non-Part B agency/program; OR • Continuing a non-Part B agency’s service after exiting from Part C (e.g. WIC, Head Start) that the child was already receiving during his/her time in Part C; OR • Sharing information with families about potential resources/services (whether the families contact/access that resource or not). <p>Note 1. If a child was already receiving a service (e.g. WIC and/or Early/Head Start) and was going to continue, you would consider that as “referred to other programs” — EOP.</p> <p>Note 2. In order to use EOP, the team would have conducted the Suspected Disability discussion.</p>
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Code	Reason	Description
ENR	Not Eligible for Part B, <u>Ex</u> ited with <u>n</u> o <u>r</u> eferrals	<p>Child who reached age 3 (third birthday); team had conducted Suspected Disability discussion; was determined not eligible for Part B either through the Suspected Disability discussion or a full and individual initial evaluation for special education; and was NOT referred to other programs.</p> <p>ENR is also used for a child who reached age 3 (third birthday); team had conducted Suspected Disability discussion and child was suspected of having a disability; and parent(s) declined consideration for Part B eligibility determination; and was NOT referred to other programs.</p> <p><i>Note.</i> ENR is intended to reflect the rare times when the family was not referred to other community services by the time the child turned three.</p> <p>Referral means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A referral by an IFSP team member to a non-Part B agency/program; OR • Continuing a non-Part B agency's service after exiting from Part C (E.g. WIC, Head Start) that the child was already receiving during his/her time in Part C; OR • Sharing information with families about potential resources/services (whether the families contact/access that resource or not).
BND	Part <u>B</u> eligibility <u>n</u> ot <u>d</u> etermined	<p>Child whose parents consented to a full and individual initial evaluation for special education, however, Part B eligibility was not determined by the child's third birthday.</p> <p><i>Note.</i> Include in this category any child <i>who reached age 3</i> for Part C, and who has not been reported in EFB, EOP, or ENR. This would be a rare occurrence.</p>

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Code	Reason	Description
CMK	<u>M</u> oved out of State, <u>k</u> nown to be <u>c</u> ontinuing IFSP services	Child who moved out of State and is known to be continuing Part C services. Do not report a child who moved within State (i.e., from one region to another) if services are known to be continuing.
CMN	<u>M</u> oved out of State, <u>n</u> ot known to be <u>c</u> ontinuing IFSP services	Child who moved out of State and for whom it is not known whether child is continuing Part C services. Include situation where it is known that the child will not be continuing Part C services.
SDP	<u>S</u> ervices <u>d</u> eclined by <u>p</u> arent	All IFSP services discontinued due to parent request.
DEC	<u>D</u> eceased	Child who died after his/her third birthday, even if his/her death occurred at the age of exit.
UNK	<u>U</u> nknown/ Attempts to contact unsuccessful	Child, under the age of 3, who had an active IFSP, and for whom Part C personnel have been unable to contact or locate the family or child after repeated, <i>documented</i> attempts. <i>Note.</i> Include in this category any child who did not complete his/her IFSP, exited Part C before reaching age 3, and who has not been reported as DEC, CMK, CMN, or SDP. <i>Note.</i> Use this code if resident city and state are unknown.
